This month, we bring section 7.6 to your attention. As we head into the winter season, it is a good idea for those camps with Snow Camp Programs to review this section of standards.

Here is a brief summary of this section:

7.6.1 Reminds us that Snow Camping should have detailed procedures (including but not limited to health and safety, transportation, emergencies and training).

Campers and staff must be physically fit and aware of the risks and demands of the activity, and medical/registration forms need to show that they are prepared.

Staff must prepare, train and assess conditions for all snow camping programs. There must be a sufficient number of staff (3:8), with appropriate first aid training.

Snow camping programs must not take place in avalanche terrain without a professional guide.

Snow Camping, as with all Camping Programs, should follow Leave-No-Trace Principles of Minimum Impact Camping.
